Interim Rector's Message

"Behold, I am Doing a New Thing"
Our Theme for 2024

Dear Christ Church Parish,

Our theme and prayer focus for this year is "Behold I am Doing a New Thing" (Isaiah 43:19). At the time Isaiah wrote these words, God was calling his people back home to Jerusalem after forty years of exile. God was calling them to reinvent themselves after a very, very difficult time in their history. God was calling them to see themselves in a new way for a new chapter in God's love story with the human race.

What new thing is God doing here at Christ Church in 2024? He is calling us to see ourselves and our parish life in a new way. Just as the people of Israel needed to reinvent themselves to rebuild Jerusalem 2,500 years ago, so God is calling us to rebuild our parish community in a new era that is very different from the 1950's and 1960's when the wider culture was supportive of the Church and its role in our society. We are now in the midst of a cultural drift away from Christian faith and practice and it has affected every denomination and nearly every parish community. How do we survive and thrive in this new context?

At a recent Vestry meeting, someone said: "We have a beautiful church building, we have a wonderful choir and music program, we have great financial resources, we have good leadership from the clergy and staff. What we need is a congregation. (long pause......)

We need to grow our congregation. How do we do that?"

That is an excellent question. In fact, I have been asking myself, and asking God, the same question since the first day I walked into Christ Church on January 1, 2023.

The church communities that are surviving and thriving in this new cultural context are the ones in which members have an up-close and personal love of Jesus and a zeal for sharing that love with others. For lack of a better term, let's call it "contagious Jesus-focused faith".

God is calling us to be a vibrant Christ-centered and mission-focused parish community. Congregations grow and have an impact when members are excited about knowing Jesus and sharing his love with others. People join churches when people who are excited and enthusiastic about their faith invite them to "come and see".

This is why we are doing the ALPHA Course on Sunday mornings. The goal is to help everyone develop a deep and abiding connection with our Lord and Savior and to become mission-minded people who have a contagious faith. This is the New Thing that God is doing in our midst. I invite you all to open your eyes and see. And open your life to God's call.

LINCOLN SCHOOLS

MARCH 2024

Every Tuesday while school is in session CEC makes a Lincoln School delivery. There are always two dozen loaves of bread plus a case of peanut butter or jelly depending on which is in short supply. The other items are dependent on my weekly conversation with the Community Liaisons.

I always ask the Liaisons if they have a family story to share. This time the answer surprised me. Instead of hearing about a family I was told there are too many to tell me about. There are children who live in cars; with family members but not their immediate family; in motels whose rooms have no amenities like a microwave and at safe places like Some Place Safe. There is a need for even more food bags than ever before.

The Liaisons prepare 50 weekly emergency food bags and 10 boxes for Friday distribution ensuring the children and their families have food for the weekend. This week I learned there was another addition - the Happy Bag. A little boy came to the Pantry and said he needed a Happy Bag and went on to explain that he needed food for his dinner that evening. Now Happy Bags are made daily.

The Pantry now has a refrigerator which has expanded their food item selections. In addition to ramen noodles, mac and cheese, spaghetti Os, fruit cups, peanut butter and jelly the Pantry can now offer Uncrustables, Go-Gurts, Lunchables, string cheese, fresh fruits and vegetables (carrots and ranch dressing favorites) plus cereal bars and peanut butter crackers. Happy Bags will include a dry and refrigerated item plus a fruit cup.

The needs of the children continues to grow and the Liaisons are pressed for time to get everything done. They can use help to make emergency food bags and boxes, Happy Bags and stock the shelves. Please contact Linda Day at lindabday@aol.com or 330-395-8818 if you have a couple of hours to spare.









